
The Choir School has earned a place as the Newport County area's premier children's choir, having trained and performed in England for two weeks in 2018, traveled to New York City and Washington, DC, performed at local and regional festivals in its home state including the 2021, 2022, and 2023 Newport Folk Festivals, and issued its first commercial recording. Our mission is:

"Forming lives of character and service through the joy and discipline of intergenerational choral music."

The nonsectarian afterschool program serves a diverse student body from all over Aquidneck Island, rehearsing on Thursdays in Portsmouth and occasional Sundays. Choristers receive a modest stipend based on their attendance, training and achievement according to the *Voice for Life* curriculum of the Royal School of Church Music. The RSCM is a world-wide organization devoted to the principle that children are capable of singing the finest choral music in its original form (written for children singing the soprano line in a centuries-old tradition). The boy and girl sopranos are usually joined by adult volunteer and professional singers. A week of intensive residential choir camp in Connecticut each August, group meals and recreation, and educational touring (including to Argentina in 2024) are part of the professional chorister experience.

All this has developed under the truly inspired leadership of the School's founding director/organist/composer, Peter Stoltzfus Berton. Having had one very successful choir trip in England in 2018, plans are now firm for an educational visit to Argentina next summer. And so, another enriching experience for both the young choristers and the adult chaperones & singers who will accompany them.

The other element that has permitted this maturing growth is the huge amount of volunteer time given to making things run smoothly. The School is not a "fee for service" performing group. The modest stipend given choristers and other salaries & logistic expenses are underwritten by generous donors. So bluntly put, we really, really hope you will also help us – first and foremost by referring youngsters who might profit from involvement with the School, and also by your monetary contributions, and patronage of our advertisers. For our tenth anniversary in 2024, we are building an endowment to sustain this worthy enterprise.



Tea, Tunes, and Royal Chat with Barry Rose, OBE

Endowment Fundraising event, Sunday, February 4, 2024, 3:30 to 5:00 p.m. at St. Mary's Episcopal Church, 324 East Main Road, Portsmouth

One of the UK's most distinguished and experienced choral directors, Barry Rose came to music by a very non-traditional route. Born in London, he left school at sixteen to take up a career in insurance, but at the age of twenty-four, decided to give it up to "have a go at music." Gaining a place at London's Royal Academy of Music, he then proceeded to fail every examination, but whilst still a student, was appointed as the first Organist and Master of the Choristers of the new Guildford Cathedral, out of over 140



applicants. At Guildford he created a men and boys choir from scratch, and within five years they were recording bestselling albums for EMI, as well as regularly broadcasting and touring. It was through the high reputation of the Guildford choir that Dr. Rose was offered the post of Religious Music Adviser to the BBC (a post he was to hold for twenty years), and also the post of Master of the Choir at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, where he and his family moved in 1974.

While at St. Paul's he directed the music on several great State and Royal Occasions, including Her Majesty the Queen's Silver Jubilee Service, and also the Wedding of Prince Charles and Princess Diana in 1981. He introduced the choristers to a new and exciting world of pop recordings, and they recorded with such artists as Sir Paul McCartney and Sir Elton John, as well as making their own hit record of My Way, which gained a Gold Disc within six weeks of being issued. Dr. Rose's last full-time post was as Master of the Music at St. Albans Abbey, where he and his family spent ten happy years before "retiring" to rural Somerset.

25 Dr. Rose has been a regular visitor to the USA since 1972, advising and directing many choirs, both at parish level, as well as with the prestigious program at Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue, New York. In January 2024 he will be working with the boys and girls of Grace Church in New York, leading a festival of three Connecticut choirs who have combined annually for over twenty years under his guidance, and spending



a day in Newport rehearsing with us ahead of his talk. He trained and directed the Choir School on tour in England in 2018, and returned to us in February 2023 to lead a memorable service of Choral Evensong at St. George's School Chapel which may be viewed on our website.

His memoir Sitting on a Pin, published in 2021, tells some of the "war stories" which come most vividly to life in his own presence. (It's available on Amazon and you can bring yours to be signed!) He describes the talk he will present at this Tea as an "informative entertainment."

If you really want to know what goes on behind the apparently wellordered Services and Royal Occasions at the great English Cathedrals, please come along, and bring your friends, on Sunday the 4th of February. It's an experience not to be missed.







Sing one verse of each hymn in the Episcopal Hymnal 1982...720 hymns in all, ending with the National Anthem at around 6 pm.

Choir members will come and go as able, perhaps with a strategy based on your generosity! Sing along, or just watch the spectacle! Enjoy exploring new hymns, or grumble about 'em!





Forms allow sponsoring a particular *singer* for each hymn sung, a particular *hymn*, *the whole choir* (however many may be singing, per singer per hour), each *hymn-unit sung* (one person singing one verse = 1 unit), or a simple *flat-rate donation*. Donations support our 2024 Tour to Argentina.

LIVE ACTION FUN! (Must be present to play)



Ring the bell loudly to buy an extra verse, or two, or as many as you dare.

To avoid confusion: Please ring near the END of a verse to buy the next verse. Or, ring at the BEGINNING of the verse being sung to buy the FINAL verse (with descant, if enough singers make that possible).

This gives singers time to get the descant ready. Descants cost extra! (Price on screen) Bell price is posted next to the bell and will change, to help keep the day on pace.



'Gong' the cymbal loudly to cancel singing this hymn and proceed immediately to the next.

Gong price is posted next to the cymbal and will change, to help keep the day on pace.

The organist may pay to gong a hymn!

Especially if it's really hard, like No. 196! (Sometimes it beats practicing...)

Shoot the Moon: \$100.00 Ring the bell and the gong several times together.

This will buy the entire hymn (all verses), and gong the next several hymns, as many as there were additional verses past verse 1.

Yes we take requests! \$60.00 to request that a hymn be sung out of order (or sung again)...must be from The Hymnal 1982. Please make your request to an usher, by hymn number. You may request which starting verse is sung. Bells and gongs may apply. Following your hymn, we return to where we were when we were so richly interrupted.















About the medals and ribbons worn by certain singers

The Choir School uses the curriculum and promotion system developed by the Royal School of Church Music, a world-wide organization. Promotions are decided by the choir director based on: 1) demonstrated progress in regular performances and rehearsals, including tests of musical skills and terms; 2) punctual and consistent attendance, and 3) consistent behavior. Stipends increase with rank. Upon graduation from the choir, a singer keeps the medal and ribbon of the rank held at that time. The levels are:

NOVICE – A singer in training wears a red robe only

SINGER – (White level) adds the white surplice worn over the robe

JUNIOR – (Light Blue level) adds a medal worn on a light blue ribbon

SENIOR - (Dark Blue ribbon)

CHORISTER – (Red ribbon / gold for advanced theoretical knowledge)

LEAD SINGER – (Green ribbon)

HEAD CHORISTER – (Purple ribbon with a special medal)

Joining the Choir

What a child can expect...

- *A monthly stipend is paid for weekday rehearsals and performances, based on your attendance and level. Stipends range from \$12 up to \$40 per month.
- * Singing well is hard work, and also a lot of fun!
- * Making new friends who are excited about music.
- * Travel, non-singing activities, and a fantastic choir camp in August, including a team-building ropes course, swimming, and campfires.
- * Sing the world's greatest choral music in its original form, not simplified versions for "children's choir."
- * Rehearsing one night a week from 4:30 to 7:30 which includes dinner, plus singing an average of one performance per month.
- * Rehearse in a beautiful, safe, inspiring place.

What a parent can expect...

- * Refocus your child off the couch and off screens!
- * Brain Power! The study of music stimulates and often dramatically enhances a child's intellectual development and academic performance. A choral education teaches problem solving, spatial reasoning, cooperation, and an appreciation of excellence, along with patience.
- * Community. Parents will find themselves part of an extended and vital "choir family," proud of the whole team's accomplishments.
- * Commitment. The most important requirement is an unwavering commitment of time.
- * Thanks to the Choir School's generous supporters, there is no tuition fee, for a training value worth several thousand dollars of music lessons a year. Fees required for camp and some trips; scholarship aid is available.
- * While the ideal admission windows are in January and June, we are happy to receive inquiries at any time. If you know a child who may be interested in this potentially life-changing experience, please fill out the form at **choirschoolri.org/contact**, or call the Executive Director at (401) 239-9713. You'll be glad you did! A 20-minute family interview is scheduled, which in a relaxed way assesses vocal range, ear, English language reading level, and an ability to commit to the program schedule.

WHEREAS, the 2018 tour of England will allow The Choir School choristers to serve as ambassadors for Newport County and the United States, sharing the best of what they are learning about other cultures and traditions, and it will educate and prepare them for finer service upon their return home; and

WHEREAS, The Choir School choristers will encourage awareness of their program by singing at cultural events such as local music festivals, fundraisers for charities, meetings of arts organizations, tree lightings in December, and summer baseball games; and

WHEREAS, The Choir School's production of the NEWPORTOPOLY game celebrates the City of Newport, Rhode Island, and is a fun and informational activity enjoyed by locals and tourists alike. Proceeds from the sale of NEWPORTOPOLY will benefit The Choir School's trip to England. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

Why Travel Abroad?

Like the 2018 England tour announced in 2014, a lofty goal which gave the school its secure start, we're going on another tour, which was twice delayed by a pandemic. On August 18-27, 2024, the School will be traveling to Buenos Aires and Mendoza, Argentina. Three primary reasons for this travel are:

- * **To educate our choristers** and prepare them for even finer service when they return home.
- * **To serve as ambassadors** representing our city and country, sharing the best of what we are while experiencing another culture.
- * To encourage awareness of our choir program in our community, ensuring its strong future.

Why South America? We wanted to travel somewhere other than England, which is not the only justly famous place where children, education, and intergenerational choral music intersect. South America has quite a corner on the formative early music education market as well. We'll be partnering with two institutions that are part of a now worldwide system (literally, "El Sistema") that began in neighboring Venezuela, much as the Royal School of Church Music began in England, for an unforgettable journey of education coupled with a local service project and enthusiastic audiences.

We made a deposit for this amazing journey two years ago which locked in pre-inflation pricing. Several choir parents will attend as chaperones, as occurred on the England trip. **The tour is conducted and insured by WorldStrides.com, a major international educational touring company.** If you are interested in attending as a "groupie," please contact the School for information in order to register by February 1, 2024.




Piano Outreach Program

Peter Stoltzfus Berton (Founding executive director, meaning: music direction, vision, fundraising, graphic design, logistics, and just about anything else you can think of) graduated from the University of Michigan School of Music (bachelor's degree, organ) and the Yale School of Music (master's degree, organ). A chance occurrence with the men and boys choir of All Saints Church, Worcester, MA in 1988 led him on a journey ultimately landing as Assistant Organist of Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue, NYC, where for two years after graduate school he was immersed in the country's last remaining residential choir school of epic world-class intensity. Following a return to All Saints, Worcester as music director for seven years, and fruitful posts in Brooklyn NY, Los Altos, CA, and West Hartford, CT, he landed in Newport to found the Choir School. Following the advice of cherished mentors, his touchstone phrase would be: "Bloom where you are planted." He is also Chapel Organist of St. George's School and Adjunct Music Faculty, working with SG students and his boss Kate Longo. He adores his family, the place he has been planted, and (a bit) model trains.

Kate Longo (Associate faculty, teaching theory, voice, and charisma) has served as the music director at St. George's School since 2019. A native of Newport, she graduated from the University of Connecticut with a bachelor's degree in music and education; the University of Oregon with a master's in music choral conducting; and the University of Miami with a doctorate in choral conducting. She began her teaching career at Farmington High School in Connecticut. Following her doctoral studies, Kate served as coordinator of choral studies and choral director at Florida International University, while conducting the training choristers of the Miami Children's Chorus. Though her career took her all around the country, Kate has always been drawn back to Aquidneck Island and is happy to be an active musician here at home with her husband and two Choir School children. When she is not singing, teaching, or conducting, she can be found near the ocean enjoying the breeze and waves year round.
